Position Summary

The Philanthropy Manager (PM) is responsible for assisting in the development and execution of the comprehensive fundraising plan for the Novant Health Presbyterian Medical Center (PMC) Foundation for the Greater Charlotte Market. This includes supporting any major gift initiatives, including, but not limited to campaigns and planned giving. This position is primarily responsible for building the major gift pipeline through active management and development of major gift donors for the Novant Health Foundation in the Charlotte Market. As an active and visible member of the Charlotte community, the PM will initiate, build and foster key relationships with physicians, grateful patients/families, community members, business leaders and other constituents. The ideal PM will be a self-starter, driven by success, entrepreneurial in spirit, resilient, resourceful and collaborative. As a member of the Foundation team, the PM will work closely with prospect research to build a strong major gift portfolio through data-driven identification and thoughtful qualification; they will use their professional skills and experience to effectively identify, cultivate, solicit, and steward major gift opportunities. As a representative of Novant Health, the PM will attend community and foundation events to advance the mission of

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the health system and strengthen overall donor relations. The PM will engage volunteers and utilize them appropriately in executing fundraising strategies. Building a sustainable portfolio, implementing moves management and maintaining a donor pipeline will be key responsibilities of the Philanthropy Manager's day to day activities.

The PM will focus on cultivating donors and prospects with an annual capacity greater than \$25,000 and will solicit gifts of \$25,000 or greater for assigned programs. The PM will be responsible for implementing moves management and gift strategies designed to move donors through the various stages of the giving continuum and increasing portfolio quality by identifying, cultivating and progressing new donors. Additionally, responsibilities may include management of specific Foundation programs and projects and serving as a Foundation liaison to a specific medical center within the market.

Specific Responsibilities

Process: Building the major gift pipeline through active management and development of major donors for the Novant Health Presbyterian Medical Center Foundation in the Greater Charlotte area. Cultivate donors and prospects with an annual capacity greater than \$25,000. Qualify prospective donors for the pipeline to achieve and sustain major philanthropic support for the Foundation. Solicit gifts of \$25,000 or greater for assigned programs. Establish and execute individual strategies for a portfolio of a minimum of 75 prospects and donors. Meet or exceed established fundraising goals. The PM will work closely with PMC Foundation team members and clinical teams, developing case statements, facilitating meetings and other development activities.

Leadership: Management of specific Foundation programs and projects. Serve as a Foundation liaison to a specific medical center within the Greater Charlotte market. Identify, qualify, cultivate, solicit and steward prospective and current donors, to achieve philanthropic goals for assigned programs, major fundraising initiatives and special projects. Maintain attention to detail as well as a grasp of big picture issues, while advancing individual relationships along the continuum of donor activity.

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Collaboration: Build strategic relationships and alliances with physicians and clinical teams to identify and cultivate grateful patients and families.

Quality Improvement: Maintain and provide appropriate documentation for audits and annual reports.

Customer Service: Exceed core customer service responsibilities, standards and behaviors with communication, understanding, sensitivity, teamwork, ownership, motivation, excellence and respect to donors, volunteers and teammates.
