Position Summary

Working in concert with the Vice President of Development, the Director of Development will oversee and coordinate the major gift program. Through authentic cultivation and stewardship, the Director of Development will be responsible for continuing to build the donor pipeline. This will include involvement in the annual giving program, researching donor profiles, qualifying donors, utilizing and updating Raiser's Edge, and matching interests to specific programs within Partners in Care.

This position will be responsible for effectively building and managing a major donor portfolio, leveraging the annual tribute dinner and identifying, cultivating and soliciting gifts from individual and corporate donors. The Director of Development will be responsible for fostering a culture of philanthropy internally and externally. This position will be a key player in increasing philanthropic revenue. By maintaining secure, positive relationships with current and prospective donors, the Director of Development will help build programs and processes needed for a sustainable fundraising program. This position will also work closely with the communications/marketing team to incorporate philanthropy related messaging through appropriate channels.

Specific Responsibilities

- Work closely with Vice President on development strategies.
- Increase pipeline of major gift donors.
- Implement moves management and escort donors through the giving cycle.
- Build and manage a major gift portfolio.
- Oversee annual giving program.
- Establish authentic and genuine relationships with PICF stakeholders.
- Qualify, cultivate and solicit donors.
- Steward donors as appropriate.
- Effectively utilize the “corporate matching fund” program.
- Assemble prospect research relevant to donor histories, abilities and conversations.
- Identify opportunities that have aligned focus.
- Update donor files relative to moves management, priorities and notes.
- Prioritize donor acquisition and donor renewal.
- Utilize social media to elevate fundraising.
- Oversee online donation processes.
- Be a key partner in maximizing sponsorships and opportunities related to the annual tribute dinner.

- Planned Giving knowledge.

- Ability to build trust through authentic relationships.
- Firm commitment to high integrity and high ethical standards.
